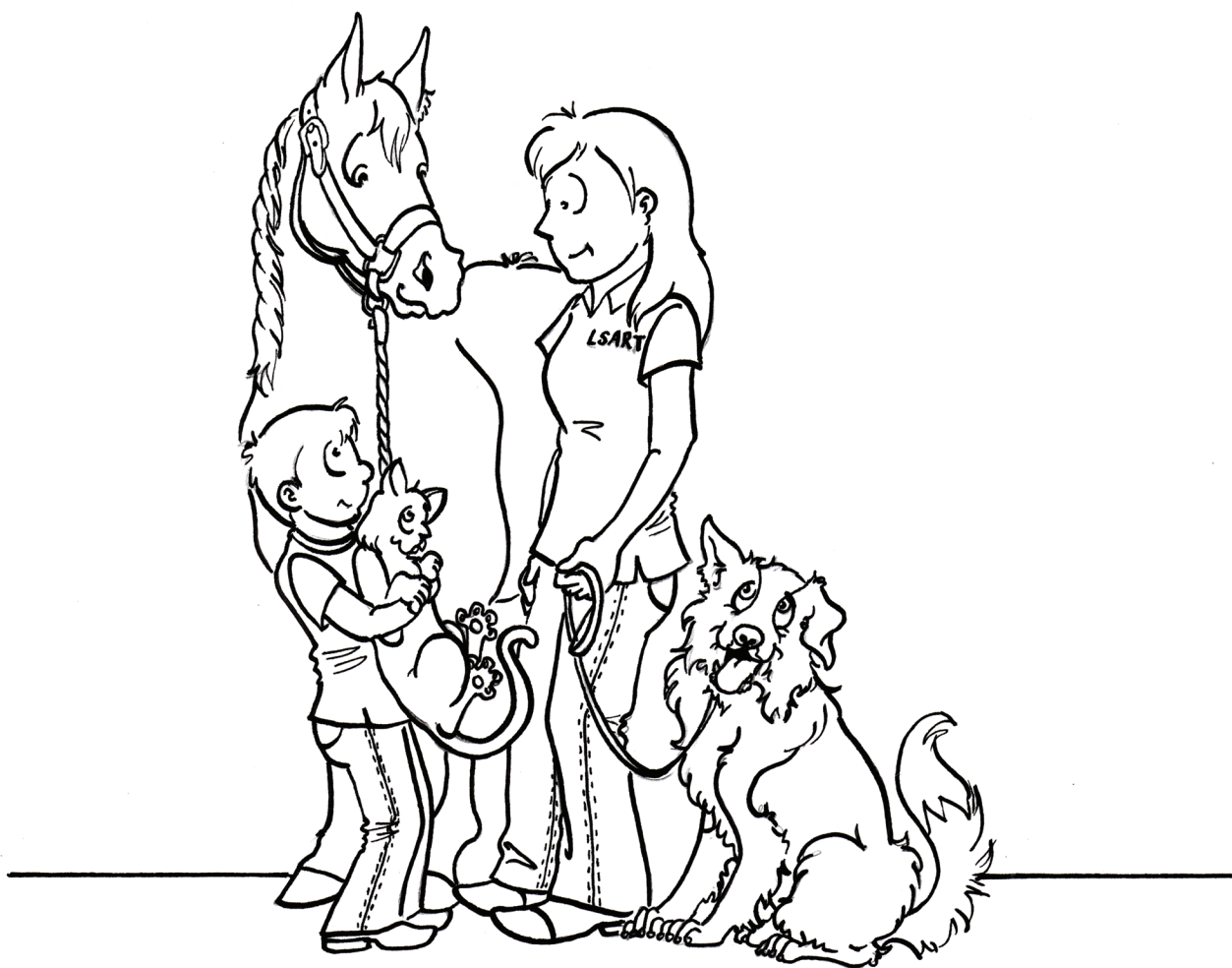
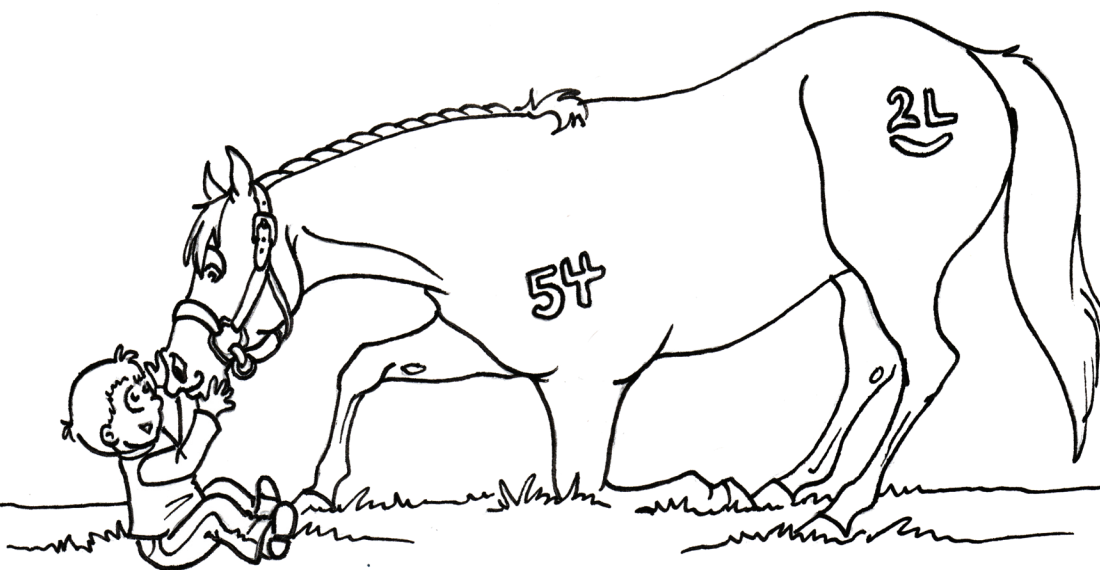


Hurry, Hurry, Hurricane!

face and was the inspiration to this rhyme.

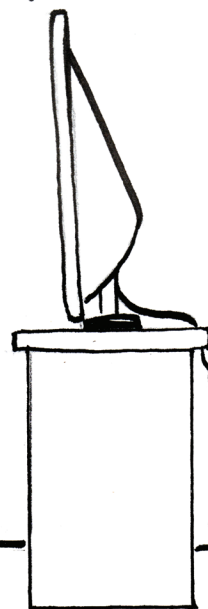
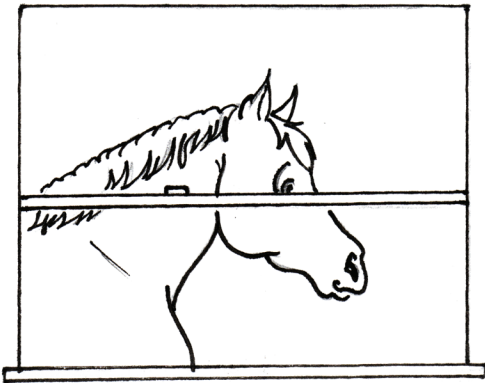

or some hotels will let your pet stay.

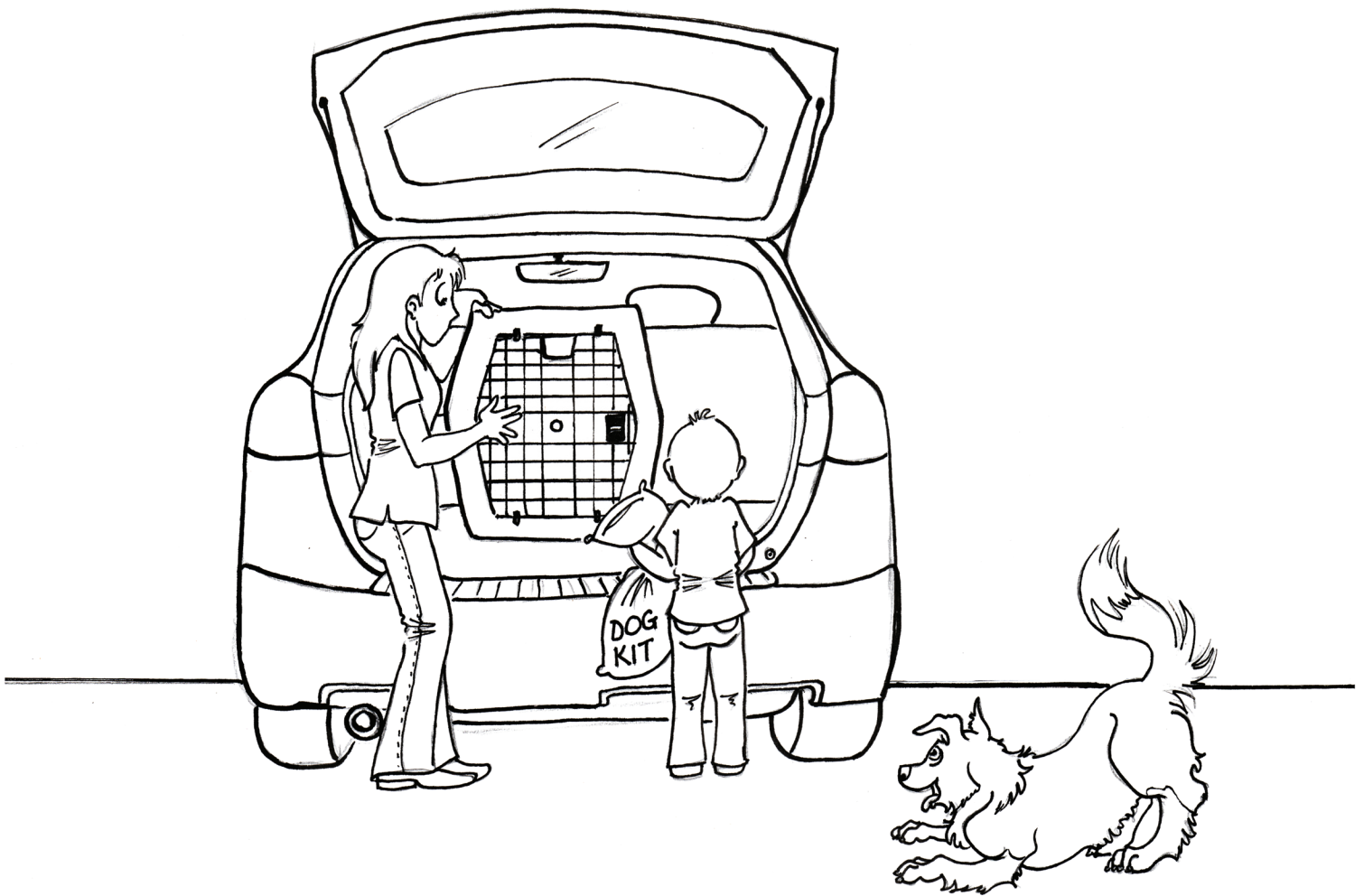
Hurry, Hurry, Hurricane!

Hurry, Hurry, Hurricane!

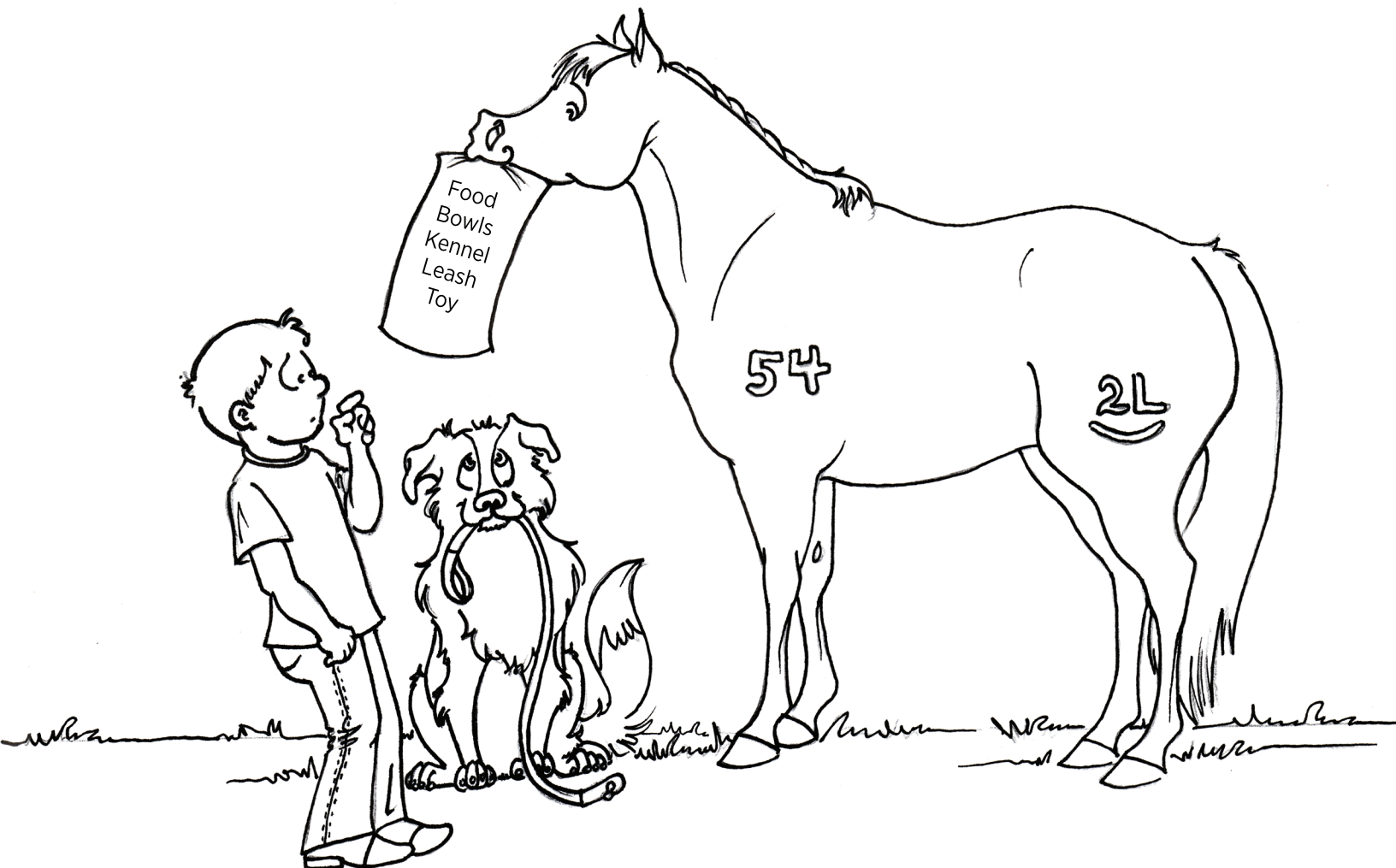
Rowen packs suitcases for everyone.

Ralph's Responders

Emergency Pet Check List

- Enough food/water for one week
- Medications for two weeks
- Photo of pet(proof of ownership), registration papers, and care instructions/microchip number
- Proof of vaccinations/rabies tag
- Food/water bowl
- Collar(with ID tag)/leash
- Portable kennel/carrier
- Blanket/comfort toy
- Litterbox/litter
- Poop bags
- Wet wipes
- Exotic pets- bring habitat, heat lamps, extension cords

*Be sure to have your veterinarian microchip your pet along with recommended vaccinations and heartworm preventative.
